BENEFICE LETTER

€



Re-creation and the changing seasons of life I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. (Ezekiel 36:26)

September sees the start of Creation Season in the Anglican Church. I've often thought that maybe Springtime would be more suitable for celebrating God's creation - Spring after all is the season of growth, of re-creation. So why choose September?

September is the month of seasonal transition from Summer to Autumn. The Equinox (from Latin aequus 'equal' and nox 'night') is the time of year when night and day are of almost equal length. It occurs on the 23rd this year, and marks the first day of autumn. Nature is on a threshold, leaving behind new growth and looking forward to lying dormant. Many plants are dying back, leaves are turning and starting to fall, and land is being prepared for next year's crops. What with that and the gradually shortening days, it feels more like an ending than a beginning. But celebrating Creationtide at this time serves to remind us that endings lead to new beginnings.

Seasons in nature are cyclical - no season can last for ever, but it will return - life will be recreated. Autumn is also closely related to life's changing seasons, our journey from young to old. Each of life's seasons has its high and low points, but just as the natural world moves on, so do we, embracing the next phase. We may miss our childhood innocence, yet revel through our teens and twenties in a newfound confidence. Later, the freedoms of youth are missed once we become parents and need to focus on bringing up a family. But once the family nest is empty, we rediscover life's freedoms and opportunities. The phases of life are like the seasons - not endings, but opportunities for change, rest and renewal. For seasons are only seasons, they are not permanent. If we feel low as the light and warmth of summer recede, we take comfort from knowing it will return. Perhaps we can apply that to other difficult times, our seasons of anxiety that will ultimately recede, allowing us to rediscover serenity. However, it may require time, and another thing that nature teaches us is the need for patience. "Be patient........ The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains", we are told in James 5:7-8. Some things can't be hurried, however much we may wish that they could. That holds especially true for healing (be it physical or of the mind), for mending relationships, and for finding joy after grief.

We can't stop the seasons, any more than we can stop growing old, but just as the dying of the leaves in autumn brings forth a magnificent colour display, so too will life come up with uplifting surprises, sometimes when we least expect them.

"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Cor. 5:17).

Curious about Faith?



Renovations at All Saints, Steeple Langford Church



Dear Friends,

We explained back in the spring that All Saints' church requires some significant and necessary restoration work to the lower walls of the building. This will involve the removal of old and blistering cement plaster in the nave, ringing chamber and north isle and be replaced by lime plaster and painted. In addition, the pews will have to be moved to enable access to the lower walls.

The Church Council has obtained a Faculty (church planning consent) from the Diocesan and the work will be undertaken by Foyles. As a consequence, for health and safety reasons the church will be closed between 1st September and 1st December inclusive.

Second Sunday services (a Eucharist) may be held in other churches details of which will be publicised. The 4th Sunday service will be held in the Village Hall. In addition, we will place further information as the work progresses on the church door and noticeboards.

This work is important and will cost a considerable amount. A proportion of the work will be funded though the Jane Lemon bequest to the church, part of which enabled the lovely restoration of the East end. However, the bulk of the funding for this work will come from our own church funds. In the UK, local churches receive absolutely no funding from Government sources for their day-to-day life. All the money spent on maintaining these beautiful buildings and the graveyard, for our worship and for projects such work as this, comes from the generosity of our congregation and the local community for which we are very grateful. 
