

Dear friends.

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 as a response to the growing authoritarianism in Italy and more general secularism and atheism. Pius recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations, reminding us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

Given the global political conflicts of the early twentieth century, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Christian faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's writings gave all Christians hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind".

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man ~ he is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. Pius concluded: "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures".

The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives:

Christ must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, 'as instruments of justice unto God.'

We, the Church and individually, are called to acknowledges the reign of Christ, not just privately, but publicly. As one writer concluded: "we are encouraged to celebrate and live out our faith in public. When our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives.

We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe". Amen.
